

#### **NOTES FROM THE NURSES - ASTHMA INFORMATION**

Asthma symptoms can worsen in different environments and may vary throughout the year. For some students, asthma can be affected by the winter season. The dry, cold winter weather can irritate the airways. More time spent indoors means more exposure to indoor irritants, and if a student has allergic asthma, allergens like pet dander and dust can worsen symptoms. Winter also brings an increased risk of viruses that can aggravate asthma.

Seasonal variations in the indoor and outdoor worlds can cause inflammation in the lungs and trigger bronchospasm (sudden narrowing of the airways). These pulmonary changes result in asthma symptoms such as wheezing, shortness of breath, and a sensation of chest tightness.

If your child has a diagnosis of asthma or reactive airway disease, it is recommended that you have an <u>Asthma Treatment Plan</u> signed and submitted from a doctor and emergency medication available for use at school. Rescue inhalers are the recommended treatment for asthma attacks at school, however, the nurses can also do nebulizer treatments, if necessary.
