#### COMMUNITY FLU FACTS AND PREVENTION TIPS FROM THE SCHOOL NURSES

Influenza is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. The symptoms of influenza are: chills, diarrhea, fatigue, fever, headache, nausea, runny nose, sore throat, and vomiting. In the United States, flu season starts in the fall and lasts through the winter. Flu activity typically peaks between December and February, but it can last until May.

Flu viruses travel through the air in droplets when someone with the infection coughs, sneezes, or talks. You can become infected when you inhale the droplets directly or pick up the germs from touching an object and then touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. People with the flu can spread it to others up to about 6 feet away.



## You can stop the spread of influenza by:

- Staying home if you are sick
- Covering coughs and sneezes
- Getting a flu vaccine each year
- Washing your hands

The seasonal influenza vaccine consists of three or four different strains of influenza, depending on the manufacturer. Each year, scientists from the World Health Organization, Centers for Disease Control, and the

Food and Drug Administration determine which strains will make up the seasonal flu shot based on the dominating strains the year before. You are encouraged to see your physician for flu vaccination, however, our local health department in Gloucester County also schedules flu shot clinics to help keep Gloucester County families healthy every flu season. 
































#### **WDHS KEY CLUB NEWS**

#### WDMS HISPANIC HERITAGE NIGHT


